

Lower Broadheath Parish Profile 2014

Overview

Annual Precept £28,000

Lower Broadheath is a rural parish covering 914 hectares. It encompasses a primary school within the boundaries of the parish. The nearest secondary school is 4.5km from the centre of the parish.

Communications and transport (nearest distances are straight lines 'as crow flies')

The nearest hospital is 7km from the centre of the parish (47min on public transport). The nearest GP practice is 4km from the centre of the parish (24min on public transport).

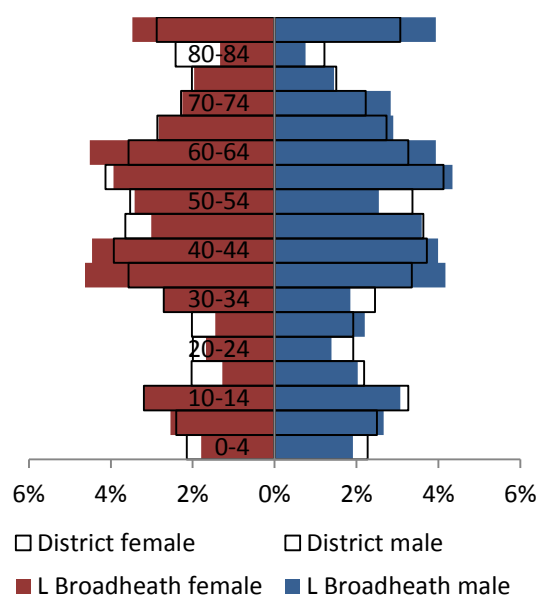

Interpretation of the Data – Lower Broadheath

This supplementary document explores some of the underlying data from the profile and links it to the data at a district-level.

Precept In 2014/15 the average parish precept in Malvern Hills was £43.66 per household and the range from £100.42 to £1.53. The precept for Lower Broadheath was £40.06 the 17th largest out of 53.

Population Lower Broadheath is the 8th largest parish in Malvern Hills. Between 2001 and 2011 the population growth was less than 1%, much less than the district-level growth of 3.4%.

Households(dwelling with residents)

The number of households has increased from 664 to 699. The largely static population has contributed to the size of households decreasing from 2.58 persons to 2.46. The number of single person households has increased by 19% from 114 to 136 (19% of all households). 63% of single person households are single pensioner households; this has increased by 16% from 73 to 85. 10 persons live in communal establishments.

Older people The number of persons aged 60 and over has increased by 47% from 389 to 571. Persons aged 75 and over have increased by 81% from 101 to 183.

The population has aged significantly and that trend is likely to continue.

Children The number of persons aged 0 to 15 has decreased by 13% from 344 to 300. This downward trend is common to two thirds of parishes.

Deprivation The Index of Multiple Deprivation shows that 14 households (2.0%) are deprived in three or four of the dimensions of employment, education, housing and health and disability, the district-level percentage is 3.2%. Housing or Council Tax benefit and JSA claimants are also lower than the district average.

Cars and vans The number of households with no access to a car/van has decreased slightly from 52 to 45 but this still means that 8% of households rely on other means of transportation.

Health The percentage of the population reporting good or very good health in each parish ranges from 91% to 75%. In Lower Broadheath it is 84% but the number of people reporting that they are healthy will likely reduce as the population ages.
