

# Hanley Castle Parish Profile 2014

## Overview

Annual Precept £19,000

Hanley Castle is a rural parish covering 1793 hectares. It encompasses a secondary school within the boundaries of the parish. The nearest GP practice and primary school are 2km away in Upton upon Severn.

## Communications and transport (nearest distances are straight lines 'as crow flies')

The nearest hospital is 8km away from the centre of the parish (44min on public transport). The nearest pharmacy is 2km away from the centre of the parish (7min on public transport).



## Interpretation of the Data – Hanley Castle

This supplementary document explores some of the underlying data from the profile and links it to the data at a district level.

<b>Precept</b>	In 2014/15 the average parish precept in Malvern Hills district was £43.66 per household and the range from £100.42 to £1.53. The precept for Hanley Castle was £33.93 the 20th largest out of 53.
<b>Population</b>	Hanley Castle is the 11th largest parish in Malvern Hills. Between 2001 and 2011 the population grew by 6%, higher than the total district growth of 3.4%.
<b>Households (dwellings with residents)</b>	The number of households has increased from 527 to 560. The population growth has contributed to the size of households remaining largely unchanged at 2.39 persons. The number of single person households has increased by 26% from 126 to 159 (28% of all households). 51% of single person households are single pensioner households, this has increased by 7% from 76 to 81. 69 persons live in communal establishments.
<b>Older people</b>	The number of persons aged 60 and over has increased by 27% from 399 to 506. Persons aged 75 and over have increased by 27% from 132 to 168. The population has aged significantly and that trend is likely to continue.
<b>Children</b>	The number of persons aged 0 to 15 has decreased by 2% from 212 to 207. This downward trend is common to two thirds of parishes.
<b>Deprivation</b>	The Index of Multiple Deprivation shows that 20 households (3.6%) are deprived in three out of the four dimensions of employment, education, housing and health and disability, the total district percentage is 3.2%. Housing or Council Tax benefit claimants are also higher than the District average but JSA claimants lower.
<b>Cars and vans</b>	The number of households with no access to a car/van has increased slightly from 33 to 38. This means that 7% of households rely on other means of transportation.
<b>Health</b>	The percentage of the population reporting good or very good health in each parish ranges from 91% to 75%. In Hanley Castle it is 81% but the number of people reporting that they are healthy will likely reduce as the population ages.

**Considerations** How to ensure that care and support for older people is sustained and developed as the population continues to age. Working in partnerships with other parishes and the statutory authorities is likely to be helpful.

How to minimise social isolation as the number of single person households increases.

How to sustain and develop public transport services particularly for the 7% with no access to a car or van.

How to ensure that deprived households have access to supporting services and benefits. Promotion of the CAB Community Liaison Volunteers may be helpful.
