

Our Youth Action Plan 2019-2022



Let young people know what services and activities are available to them in the district



Develop a Young Chairperson role for the district



Support young people to be cyber safety aware



Develop a range of engagement approaches with schools focussing on community safety and environmental protection



Launch a Digi-free Dinnertime campaign to support families to build emotional resilience and social connection



Work with partners to better promote apprenticeships (particularly at KS3) including what they are, the qualifications, those of interest to young people



Hold a district wide event to provide more opportunities and places for young people to develop and learn new skills (curriculum for life) and build resilience and social connections (also Five Year Plan action)



Support young people to build resilience and coping strategies for dealing with stress through school sessions and online tools; and offering to support in the roll out of good practice examples to high schools across the district



Work with partners and schools on specific projects based on the individual school responses to the Bigger Picture Survey



Support young people in preparing for life after school i.e. 'curriculum for life' including advice on budgeting and living independently



Develop our relationship with our high schools

- Offer KS4 students political speed dating and voter registration sessions
- Continue to hold an annual Local Democracy Day, to focus on KS3 students
