

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER
TOWN AND COUNTY PLANNING ACT 1990 S.257 AND PARAGRAPH 7 of SCHEDULE 14

THE MALVERN HILLS DISTRICT COUNCIL PUBLIC FOOTPATH NO. MV-677 (PART) MALVERN
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2015

On 2nd June 2016 Malvern Hills District Council confirmed the above order. The effect of the order as confirmed is to divert the public footpath running from point A, Ordnance Survey grid reference 378418, 246718, in a north-north-westerly, north-easterly and north-north-westerly direction for 125 metres to point G, OS grid reference 378417, 246833, a point at the junction of public footpath nos. MV-696, MV-695 and MV-676 to a line running from point A, OS grid reference 378418, 246718 in a north-north-easterly direction for 6.3 metres to point B, OS grid reference 378419, 246724 then continuing in a north-north-westerly direction for 49.7 metres to point C, OS grid reference 378402, 246771 then continuing in a north-north-easterly direction for 27.2 metres as a footway adjacent to internal adopted access roads to point D, OS grid reference 378407, 246798, then continuing in an east-north-easterly direction for 6.7 metres on a footway alongside the junction of two roads to point E, OS grid reference 378412, 246803, then continuing across the new adoptable carriageway, in a north-north-westerly direction, for 6.4 metres to point F, OS grid reference 378410, 246809, then continuing in a north-north-easterly then briefly north easterly direction across a central grassed area, on a tarmacadam path, for 26.1 metres to point G, OS grid reference 378417, 246833, as shown on the order map.

A copy of the confirmed order and order map may be seen free of charge at the The Library, Graham Road, Malvern, Worcestershire, WR14 2HH, between 9.00 am and 5.30pm on Mondays, Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays and between 9.00am and 8.00 pm on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. This order comes into force on the date on which Malvern Hills District Council certify that the terms of Article 2 of the order have been complied with, but if any person aggrieved by the order desires to question its validity or that of any provision contained in it on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he or she may apply to the High Court for any of these purposes under s.287 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 within 6 weeks from the date on which notice is first published as required by paragraph 7 of Schedule 14 to the Act.
